NIGERIA STRENGTHENING CIVIC ADVOCACY AND LOCAL ENGAGEMENT (SCALE) PROJECT

The Nigeria Strengthening Civic Advocacy and Local Engagement (SCALE) project is a five-year project

that started in 2021.

The United States Agency for International Development (USAID) funded project is being implemented

by Palladium through a cooperative agreement. The goal of the project is to improve public accountability,

transparency, and sustainable service delivery in Nigeria. The strategic objective is strengthening the

financial, management, and advocacy capacity of local civil society organizations (CSOs) and business

membership organizations (BMOs) in Nigeria to create a more accountable, transparent, peaceful, and

democratic Nigeria with more effective and efficient public service delivery.

The Project emphasizes leadership and innovation and explicitly aims to engage marginalized populations,

including women, youths, persons with disabilities, and other minorities, in the process.

The Nigeria SCALE project is implemented through five components:

Component I – Improve CSO Organizational Capacity

Component 2 - Enhance Capacity for CSO Advocacy, Collaboration, and Management

Component 3 - Improve the Policy and Regulatory Environment for CSOs

Component 4 - Countering Trafficking in Persons (CTiP)

Component 5 - Sector Strengthening & Advocacy (SGBV and CEFM)

In line with SCALE's objective of enhancing CSOs and BMOs' capacity to be positive change agents in Nigeria, ACIOE is focused on improving the capacity of the CSOs/BMOs and their ability to effectively carry out advocacy as well as building their private sector engagement as a sustainability measure.

The Advocacy Marketplace program is one of the programmatic activities organized by SCALE and facilitated by ACIOE towards implementing the mandate of Component 2 of the Nigeria SCALE Project.



ADVOCACY MARKETPLACE PROGRAM

The Nigeria SCALE project conceptualized and implemented a six-month Advocacy Marketplace Training Program for advocacy practitioners from across the country as part of the project's sustainability strategy to increase the availability of skilled advocacy training experts to support CSOs during and after SCALE. Seventeen graduates completed cohort I of the program.

This year, with a look towards enriching the local advocacy marketplace in Nigeria from the initial cohort of advocacy experts who graduated in Cohort I, ACIOE Associates was engaged under USAID Cooperative Agreements to develop an advocacy marketplace program by training Advocacy Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) in Nigeria. To this end, ACIOE enrolled 20 participants in the second cohort of the Advocacy Marketplace training program.

Goal, Objectives, and Expected Outcomes of The Advocacy Marketplace Program Goal

A robust and sustainable advocacy marketplace in Nigeria.

Objectives

- To build a crop of 40 Advocacy Subject Matter Experts within the Project period with the capacity to provide technical support to CSOs and BMOs for effective advocacy.
- To support an advocacy community of practice that will provide a forum for continuous learning and effective collaboration.
- To institutionalize the Advocacy marketplace program in Nigeria.

Expected Outcomes

- Increased access to technical support by creating a readily available pool of advocacy Subject Matter Experts (SMEs).
- Improved standard of advocacy practice among CSOs and BMOs in Nigeria.

Training Approach

The training consists

- Physical Contact Training
- Virtual Training
- Field Work (Practical)

As a strategy to ensure the utilization of the experts, ACIOE will map advocacy experts from the marketplace and link them to SCALE clusters that they will support based on capacity needs. Towards sustainability, ACIOE will, on behalf of SCALE, hold routine meetings with the Advocacy Marketplace graduates/coaches for progress reviews and action plans to use the acquired skills.

To institutionalize the Advocacy marketplace program in Nigeria, SCALE signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Nasarawa State University, Keffi.

PARTNERSHIP WITH NASARWA STATE UNIVERSITY, KEFFI

The SCALE team had observed the apparent shortage of skilled human resources in the area of Advocacy while also noting that no educational institution in Nigeria offers OD courses, as there are only bits and pieces of training for private sector and public sector reforms. The SCALE marketplace program was thus conceptualized as a sustainability strategy to close the gap and result in consultants available for deployment nationwide.

A Memorandum of Understanding was signed with Nasarawa State University, Keffi (NSUK) to further ensure its sustainability and institutionalization. As a result, Advocacy Marketplace graduates in cohort 2 will have their certificates authenticated by NSUK. Furthermore, SCALE collaborated with the Institute of Development Studies at NSUK to co-develop the program curriculum for Advocacy and OD PGD and M.Sc. courses, which could commence as soon as the 2023/24 academic season.

Nasarawa State University, Keffi







professional networks. Francisca is passionate about advocating for social justice causes, driving economic inclusion of young people, and mentoring several young people on sustainable economic pathways.




